

**MANITOBA'S HEALTH SYSTEM  
TRANSFORMATION PLAN**

Manitoba's Health System Transformation Program was established in 2018 to guide the thoughtful planning and phased implementation of broad health system changes aimed at improving the quality, accessibility and efficiency of health-care services across Manitoba.

A Transformation Blueprint was approved in 2018, which identified the implementation of changes over three waves.

The changes announced today were identified to occur in Wave Two of Health System Transformation.

These include:

- several key functions within the former Department of Manitoba Health, Seniors and Active Living were identified for transition to Shared Health at a future date, including the operation of Selkirk Mental Health Centre (SMHC) and Cadham Provincial Laboratory (CPL);
- certain Population and Public Health (PPH) functions from within the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority were identified for transition to the department; and
- consolidation of the Addictions Foundation of Manitoba (AFM) and the Manitoba Adolescent Treatment Centre into the health system were also identified as priorities to support the creation of an integrated Mental Health and Addictions service. Legislation to support this has been introduced (Bill 10, the health system governance and accountability act).

The first wave of the province’s health system transformation included the reorganization of the Department of Health, Seniors and Active Living as well as staff transitions within the health system that saw more than 12,000 employees moved to Shared Health by April 5, 2019.
