NEW EXTENSION LIBRARY CATALOGUES AVAILABLE

Rural readers without local library services have now an even wider selection of books from which to choose, according to George Noble, director of the University Extension Library. The extension library now has 40,000 volumes, and supplementary catalogues for both adult and juvenile readers have recently been issued.

Residents of Manitoba who are not served by public or regional libraries may borrow books from the Extension Library upon completing and returning an application card. There is no charge for a card and the books requested are mailed both ways free of charge.

Cardholders choose from catalogues sent to them by the Library. In addition to Catalogue No. 3, listing adult books, and Junior Catalogue No. 3, with titles of books for children, there are now the Supplementary Catalogues, No. 3-B (for adults) and Junior No. 3-A.

Readers who have not received the supplementary catalogues in their book parcels may write for them to the University Extension Library, University of Manitoba, Winnipeg.

Mr. Noble expects a heavy demand in the next few months for the books listed in the supplementary catalogues and advises readers to apply again for the books they want if their first request cannot be met. He reminds cardholders that the basic catalogues can still be used.
